COVID-19 Update 3/07

While the past few month have undoubtedly been tough for business, it is pleasing to see reports indicating that the automotive industry experienced growth in demand during June and the lead up to the end of the financial year.

With restrictions now at their lowest level to date, it is great to see more businesses re-opening and South Australians getting back to work, but we must not get complacent. It is important that we continue to maintain social distancing and good hygiene practices.

COVID-19 Flexible Work Arrangements extended

Upon application by the Motor Trade Organisations, and after negotiation with the union representatives, the COVID-19 flexible work arrangements schedule in the Vehicle Award has been extended to 31 July 2020, but only for those employers already utilising the arrangements under this schedule.

Additionally, after application by (primarily) union parties, the general COVID-19 flexible work arrangements schedule placed in approximately 100 awards including the Vehicle Award has been extended until the end of September, continuing the current unpaid pandemic leave and annual leave at half pay arrangements in that schedule.

A win for industry - Motorcycle Graduated Licensing Scheme

The State Government has this week released <u>draft legislation</u> outlining a proposed Motorcycle Graduated Licensing Scheme, following recommendations from the Centre for Automotive Safety Research (CASR) in 2018 in response to increased motorcycle rider fatalities.

After consultation with MTA members and lobbying of the State Government spanning more than two years, we are pleased to see that the proposed scheme mirrors the views of Motorcycle Industry Association SA members.

DPTI inspection feedback required

As of 1 July 2020, the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI) has brought heavy

vehicles inspections back in house, following the decision not to proceed with Stage 2 of the Heavy Vehicle Inspection Scheme at this time.

Over the next two months the MTA will be closely monitoring service levels and DPTI's capacity to meet industry expectations. We would like to hear about members' experiences – in particular:

- 1. Wait times for appointments
- 2. Issues with pick up times
- 3. Any other issues

The collection of this information will allow the MTA to provide DPTI with robust feedback on the changes. We will be running a quick weekly video conference every Friday over the next two months for members to provide feedback on their experience with DPTI.
