We are continuing our discussions with government to ensure they are aware of the situation facing the automotive industry and what they can do to support us.

Need assistance in registering for the Federal Government's "Job Keeper" payments?

If you haven't yet done so, I urge you to register for the Federal Government's "Job Keeper" program by <u>clicking here</u>. If you require any information or assistance in registering for government stimulus measures, such as this, please call us on 8291 2000.

The Job Keeper payment is intended to provide wage subsidies to businesses that are significantly affected by COVID-19 and the current economic climate. The Federal Government has announced its intention to pass additional legislation to introduce this new measure and pleasingly, the Federal Opposition has said it will not block it. If the legislation is enacted, support will be directed to employers to pass on to employees and will provide \$1,500 per employee per fortnight.

Payments will be made in May and backdated from 30 March 2020 to employers who must, and will be legally obligated to pass this money onto their employees in an effort to retain them over the next few months.
