COVID-19 Update 9/10

Federal Budget 2020-21

This week we saw the <u>Federal Budget unveiled</u> and first indications are that it is very business friendly, with a combination of investment incentives and tax cuts aimed at increasing spending.

Asset incentives that will enable businesses to write off the full value of new assets in a single year will likely see an increase in sales of agricultural machinery and utility vehicles, which is good news for members operating in these sectors.

We are also pleased to see the Federal Government listen to concerns raised by MTA agricultural machinery and vehicle dealers regarding delayed delivery dates on stock due to the impact of COVID-19 on global manufacturing and shipping. We thank MTAA CEO Richard Dudley for his advocacy on this issue at a national level, which has seen the purchase date extended until 31 December 2020 and the delivery date for eligible assets extended until 30 June 2021.

The Federal Government also announced a new \$1.2 billion 'Boosting Apprenticeship Commencements' wage subsidy, which will see the Government pay a capped 50% wage subsidy, for new apprentices commencing between 5 October 2020 and 30 September 2021. Combined with the hiring credit for eligible employees announced as part of the JobMaker scheme, we are seeing the Government transitioning from support measures to help businesses hold on to their existing employees to measures that will help kick start the economy with new employment.

With the Federal Budget set, the South Australian Budget will follow in November and we will be watching closely to see how the State Government plans to reinvigorate our economy.
